

#### LONG RANGE FUEL TANK

A long range fuel tank suitable for permanent instalation in Super Airtourers with 150/160 hp engines is currently being designed. It is expected to contain a minimum of 16 Imp gallons. A Supplemental Type Certificate and Flight Manual amendments would be required and it is expected that a further increase in MTOW would be part of the STC so as to enable two persons, fuel and some baggage to be carried.

Design and drawings on the installation will have to in part be undertaken by persons approved by the CAA to do such work and this of course will cost. To get the project off the ground some funds will be required and this would have to be shared by those interested.

It is hoped that a number of kits can be made in the first run. A final price cannot at this stage be estimated as it will depend very much on how many are involved in the first run. Installation would be best carried out at the same time as a Major Inspection as the wing must be removed to undertake the job. If done this way costs could be kept to a minimum.

If you find the motivation, have the dedication and application, go for it, I guarantee you will thoroughly enjoy the exercise. I  $\operatorname{did}$ .
